


NISRA Accommodation Performance Report

February 2024





NI Hotel Performance Summary

Northern Ireland Statistics and Research Agency (NISRA) accommodation statistics for February 2024 indicate hotel room occupancy experienced a minor decline, while bed occupancy saw growth of 3 percentage points, compared to February 2023. Room sales were above those achieved in February 2023 and bed sales increased by 15%. Year-to-date (YTD) comparisons for January-February 2024 vs 2023 are not currently available.




NI Feb '24 <u>Bed Occupancy</u>



NI Hotel Performance by LGD

Room and bed-space occupancy varied across the Local Government Districts (LGDs) which these metrics are available for during 2024 YTD (January-February). Fermanagh and Omagh LGD recorded the highest room occupancy (72%), followed by Belfast LGD (64%). Comparisons with January-February 2023 are not currently available.





NI Small Service Performance Summary

NISRA accommodation statistics for February 2024 indicate small service room occupancy (guesthouses, guest accommodation and B&Bs) experienced small increases compared with February 2023. Room occupancy for the month of February 2024 increased by 4 percentage points, while room sales increased by 18% compared to the same period in 2023. Total small service stock increased by 2% at end of January 2024, compared to January 2023.






NI Feb '24 Bed Occupancy




NI Small Service Accommodation Stock as at end January 2024 vs previous year







Room and bed-space occupancy varied across Local Government Districts (LGDs) during 2024 YTD (January-February). Belfast City LGD recorded the highest room occupancy (60%), followed by Lisburn & Castlereagh (34%). Comparisons with January-February 2023 are not currently available.



Notes:

- The Northern Ireland Statistics & Research Agency (NISRA) collect hotel and small service accommodation data through their monthly hotel survey and small service survey using a census of Northern Ireland accommodation.
- Small Service accommodation is made up of Guesthouses, Guest Accommodation and B&Bs. Further information on the accommodation categories can be found here.
- Stock used for monthly occupancy is based on the stock at the end of previous month.
- The data has been weighted for non-response, assuming no non-response bias and weighted by local authority
 and size. Due to different response rates to different parts of the questionnaire, there are different weights for
 arrivals, guests and weekend/weekday splits.
- Local government district data can only be provided when the sample size is large enough to provide a reliable estimate.
